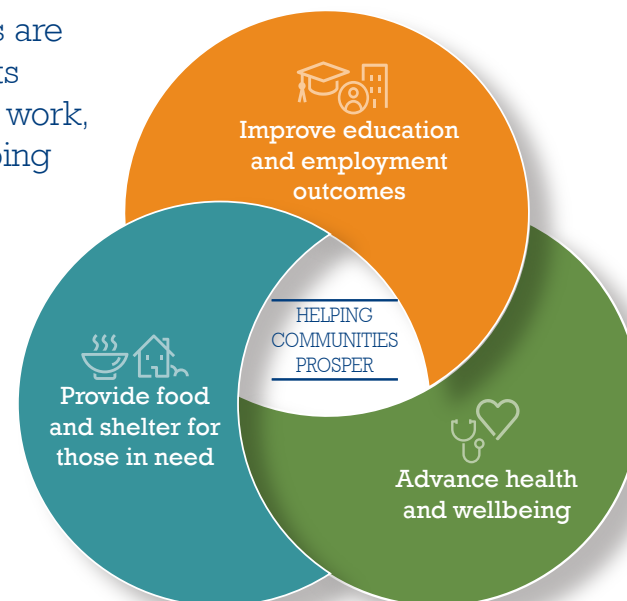

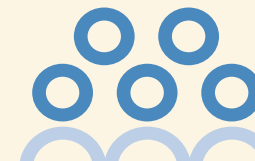

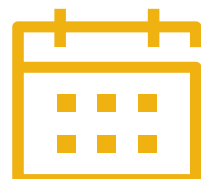
We supported **8 Art Award artists** during 2019-2020

Our Paris office launched their own **digital Art Award programme**.

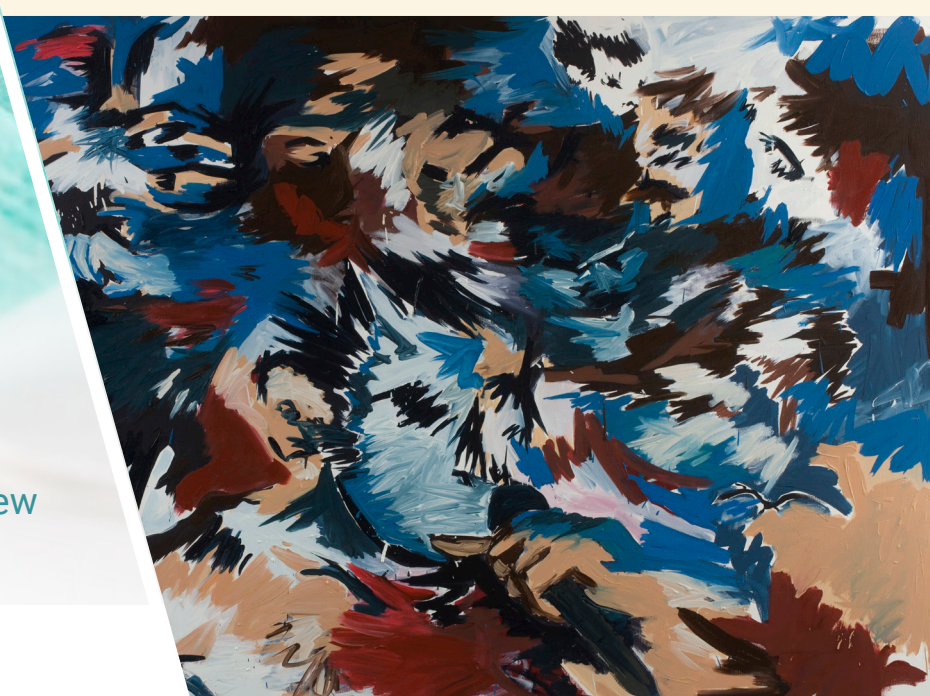
Unsung Heroes Award

Vincent Gilardi, from our Paris office, won first prize for his work with Ayud Art, which included setting up the charity and being a treasurer.

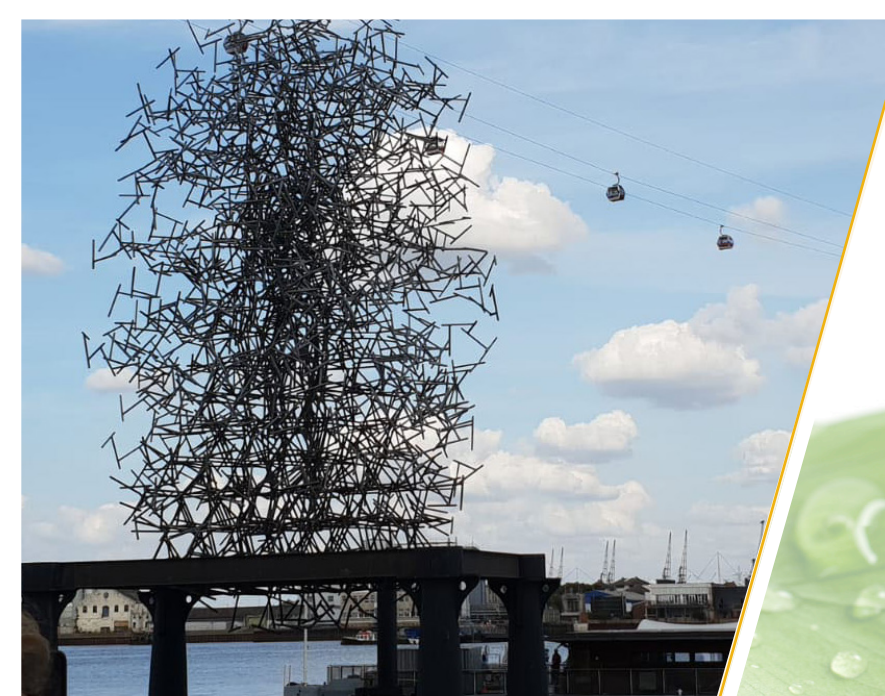


Action Medical Research COVID-19 appeal

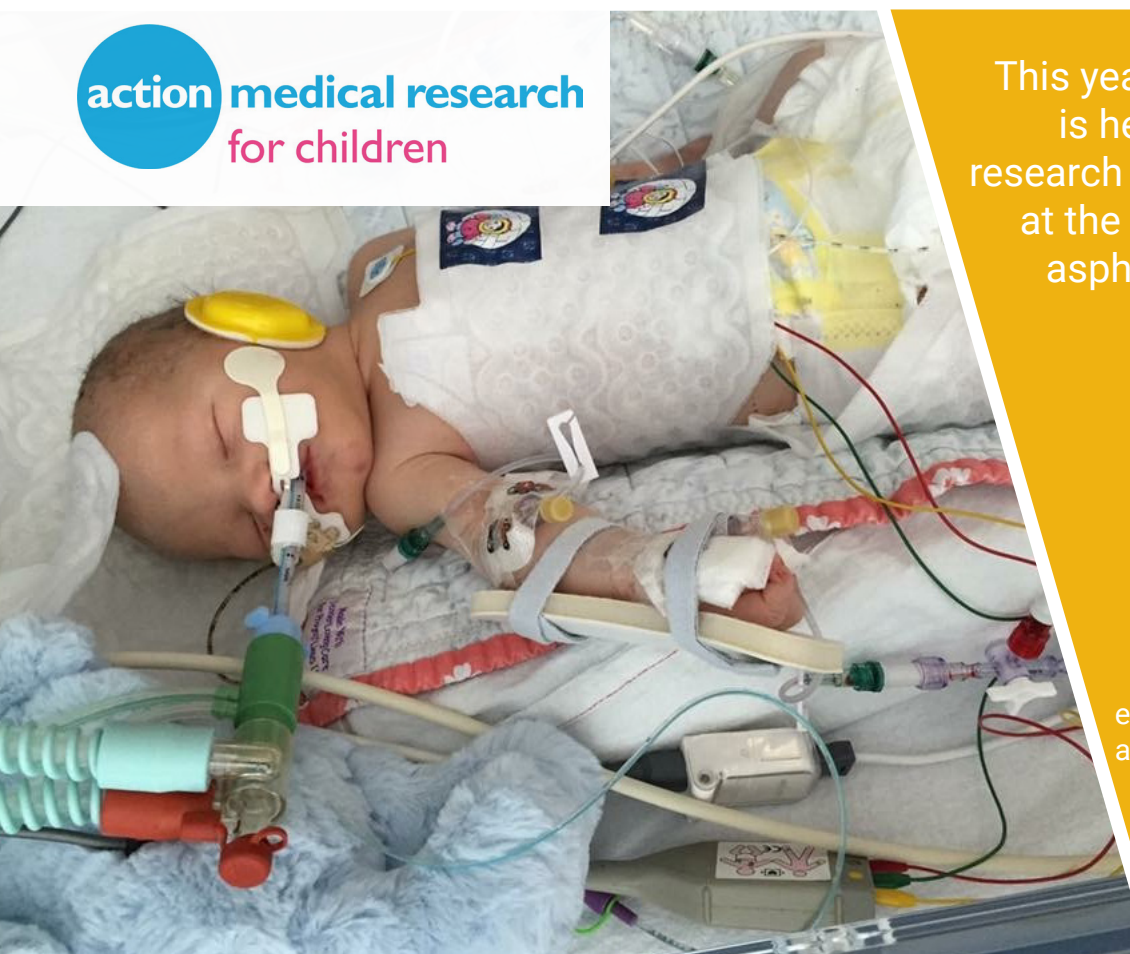
